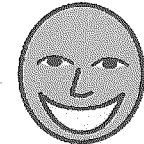
For those that couldn't attend the last coffee morning, the Moving On team have left us some information booklets which are in the reception area, if anyone would like a copy.

The next coffee morning is on Tuesday the 5th November, everyone is welcome so please come and join us if you can.

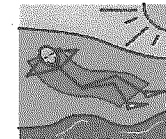
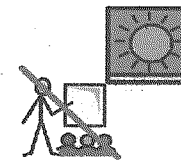

### Key Priorities for school development this school year.

I include below some of the key things we want to tackle this year to make our school even better:

What we want to do	How we will do it
<p>Improve attendance by looking for further strategies to encourage more students to attend regularly</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Embed termly 'Good attendance' assembly rewarding both high attenders and 'most improved' attenders</li> <li>• Raise profile and status of highest attenders in each class</li> <li>• Amend wording of replies to requests for absence with less tolerant stance.</li> <li>• Further work with the Educational Welfare Officer and other agencies to encourage higher attendance of key students</li> </ul>
<p>Driven by our Vision and Values, now we have identified the content of our curriculum, to consider how best to teach it.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Consider the best methodology for delivering Learning Objectives including 'standing up curriculum'</li> <li>• Careful consideration of new Baseline data and End of Year targets</li> </ul>

<p>To embed and extend our range of 'soft interventions' to further allow our students to engage in learning</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Invest in more resources to support teaching including upgrading IT hardware and software</li> <li>• Plan for and move to cloud based server and the new teaching and learning opportunities this will offer</li> <li>• Further fine tune our Independence Curriculum</li> <li>• All LSAs will be given the opportunity to select and be trained in an appropriate intervention</li> </ul>
<p>To better understand the barriers to learning for our students with Hearing and Visual impairment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide training opportunities to further our understanding of the causes, impact and ways to support students with Hearing and Visual impairment</li> </ul>
<p>To continue to develop a programme of Sixth Form work experiences in a variety of settings</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Embed and develop the role of a 'Job Coach' to secure further work experience opportunities both within and outside of school</li> </ul>
<p>To explore the potential of an off-site venue to allow opportunities for work experience, enterprise skills, developing independence and social skills.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Detailed Business Plan written and implications (financial, staffing, legal, programme of activities etc) considered in detail.</li> <li>• Potential sites researched</li> <li>• Finance identified and budgeted for</li> </ul>
